Lower Case Letters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>&gt; Letter groups are introduced based on the initial pencil stroke beginning with a starting dot which appears on the first line of each letter page. Students are challenged to recall the starting point as they practice on subsequent lines.</li> <li>&gt; Review pages with a manuscript visual reference are provided after each group of letters. Student writes the letter once with the eyes opened, next with the eyes closed to reinforce kinesthetic memory.</li> </ul>

Bridge Letters	> The group of letters that ends at the midline, not the writing line: b, o, v, w. Instruct student to think: “Where one letter ends, the next letter begins,” or “Where one letter stops, the next letter starts.” 46-49
Review Pages	> List of manuscript synonyms a-z 50-54
Capital Letters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>&gt; Letter groups are introduced based on the initial pencil stroke beginning with a starting dot which appears on the first line of each letter page. Students are challenged to recall the starting point as they practice on subsequent lines.</li> <li>&gt; Because students have learned and reviewed the lower case letters, these review lists include less familiar words to pique interest and challenge their writing skills.</li> </ul>
